It was lovely to see parents attend Tuesday's meeting regarding our recent HMI inspection and the spring term action plan for the school. As I said during the meeting, I am immensely proud of our children and staff - they all work incredibly hard every day.

From this week, I'd just like to share our new learning journals with you. All classes have now started these. The vision for these learning journals are that they should be a working journal to support our children's learning through a variety of new skills and learning experiences and that they will reflect the learning opportunities given to the children to apply new skills to tasks. The learning journals will be a source of pride for our children, and will contain the high standards of presentation, handwriting, recording and drawing which we expect at St Oswald's.

Finally, just a quick homework reminder. Children need to be learning multiplication tables and spellings which are sent home with the children on a weekly basis. Every Friday morning, the children will be tested on these. Being able to spell and have instant recall of all multiplication tables by the end of year 6 is a crucial lifelong skill and it is essential that all of our children achieve this.

What we are learning in Nursery

In nursery, we have started our new topic around the Big Bad Wolf and the Three Little Pigs. We have been reading stories, singing songs, counting and finding out about wolves in general.

In English this week - we are working on new vocabulary and using conjunctions

What we are learning in Year 3

In maths we are continuing to work on our multiplication and division facts. Working hard on our times tables and using these in our problem solving.

In literacy this week in literacy we have continued to read the Iron Man and have started to work on our grammar. This week, a lot of the work will be looking at dialogue and the use of inverted commas.

What we are learning in Year 4

year 4, we have been looking at different methods which could be used to multiply numbers. We have looked at the rounding and partitioning methods.

In Literacy we have been punctuating speech and looking at the structure and features of a travel brochure.

In topic we have looked the key historical events in Egypt. We have also been looking at the differences between the British Isles, Great Britain and the UK and have looked at the UK's distance to Egypt.

In English, we will be planning, drafting and editing our non-chronological report this week.

In maths, we will be learning how to convert improper to mixed fractions and vice versa. We will also be looking at comparing and ordering fractions.

What we are learning in Year 6

Year 6 are on with the following this week:

English - we will be planning and writing our non-chronological report on animals using all the skills we have covered in this unit.

Maths - we will be completing our unit on perimeter and area before moving onto decimals by the end of the week.

Topic - we are looking at the importance of inheritance and variation in the human and animal world.
