What happens is that you read to your children for at least 15 minutes a day for the first 2 weeks, and at least 30 minutes a day for the second 2 weeks. WHAT WE ARE LEARNING IN SCHOOL

What we are learning in Nursery

In nursery, we have started our new topic around the Big Bad Wolf and the Three Little Pigs. We have been reading stories, singing songs, counting and finding out about wolves in general.

What we are learning in Reception

In maths, we are looking at money and learning how to add pennies together. In English, we are hoping to go out and look at local buildings and think about the materials they are made from.

What we are learning in Year 1

In maths, children are looking at place value of numbers up to 20. In English, children are using their writing skills to learn how to write a story with a beginning, middle and ending.

What we are learning in Year 2

In maths, children are continuing their work on division this week. In English this week, we are on the reading phase in our sequence of learning for English. Here, we are working on our reading comprehension skills.

What we are learning in Year 3

Our focus for maths this week is on developing a secure written method for multiplication and division. In English, we will be completing the reading phase, which has a key focus on developing reading comprehension skills.

What we are learning in Year 4

The maths focus this week for year 4 is on multiplication and the learning of multiplication tables. In English, we are starting our grammar phase, and this will have a focus on looking at how speech is represented in stories.

What we are learning in Year 5

In maths this week, we are beginning to look at fractions and how to compare and order them. In English, we will be starting our grammar phase, looking at relative clauses and the use of commas to add detail and help with clarity in our sentences.

What we are learning in Year 6

In maths, we are learning how to calculate the area of simple and compound shapes. In English, we will be identifying the features of non-fiction texts.

In maths, children will be focussing on counting and number work. In English we will be completing activities based around the Grufallo story.
